
Group Process Guidelines for Leading Groups and Classes

While some leaders are skilled in teaching or in group process, many group leaders lack the training and experience needed to facilitate groups and classes effectively. They may be new to the process of leading groups or simply were never formally trained in the skills of conducting a group.
